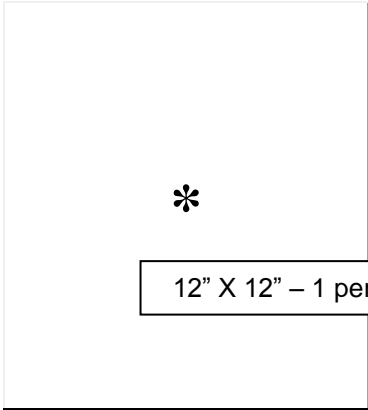


## Spacing for several plants/seeds using the Square Foot Gardening method.

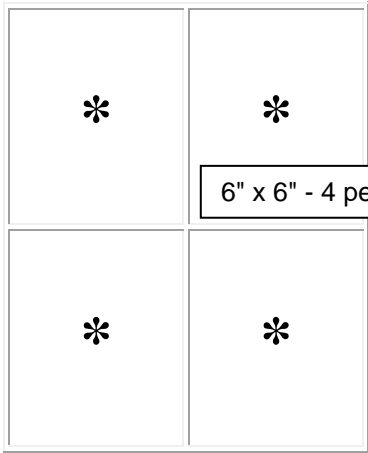
The following list and illustrations were compiled from Mel Bartholomew's original book on Square Foot Gardening. I would strongly recommend the purchase of his new book: **All New Square Foot Gardening.**

Basil: 1 per sq. ft.  
Beans: bush-type 9 per sq. ft.  
Bean: pole-type 8 per sq. ft.  
Beets: 16 per sq. ft.  
Broccoli: 1 per sq. ft.  
Cabbage: 1 per sq. ft.  
Carrots: 16 per sq. ft.  
Cauliflower: 1 per sq. ft.  
Celery: 4 per sq. ft.  
Chard(Swiss): 4 per sq. ft.  
Corn: 1 per sq. ft.  
Cucumbers: 2 per sq. ft. in a row of 4 sq. ft.  
Eggplant: 1 per sq. ft.  
Garlic: 4 per sq. ft.  
Leeks: 9 per sq. ft.  
Lettuce: 4 per sq. ft.  
Marjoram: 4 per sq. ft.  
Muskmelons: 1 per sq. ft. (grow in row of 4 squares, on trellis)  
Okra: 1 per 2 sq. ft.  
Onions: 16 per sq. ft.  
Oregano: 1 per 4 sq. ft.  
Parsley: 4 per sq. ft.  
Peas: 8 per sq. ft.  
Peppers: 1 per sq. ft.  
Potatoes: 1 per sq. ft.  
Radishes: 16 per sq. ft.  
Savory: 1 per sq. ft.  
Scallions: 36 per sq. ft.  
Spinach: 9 per sq. ft.  
Squash, Summer: vine-type: 3 per 4sq. ft.  
Zucchini: 1 per 4 sq. ft.  
Squash, Winter: 1 per 2 sq. ft.  
Sweet Potatoes: 2 per sq. ft.  
Thyme: 4 per sq. ft.  
Tomatoes: bush type: 4 per 4 sq. ft.  
Tomato: vine-type 1 per sq. ft. (in row of 4 on trellis)  
Watermelon: bush-type: 1 per sq. ft.  
Watermelon: vine-type: 1 per 2 sq. ft. - both kinds along trellises  
Zucchini: 1 per sq. ft.

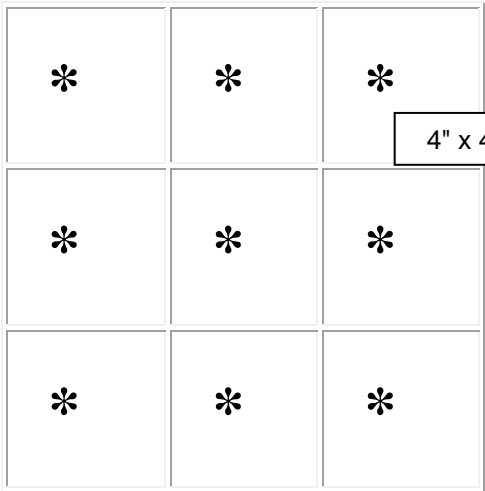
Remember, you will often recycle the same 4 X 4 foot square 4 to 5 times in one year!!!



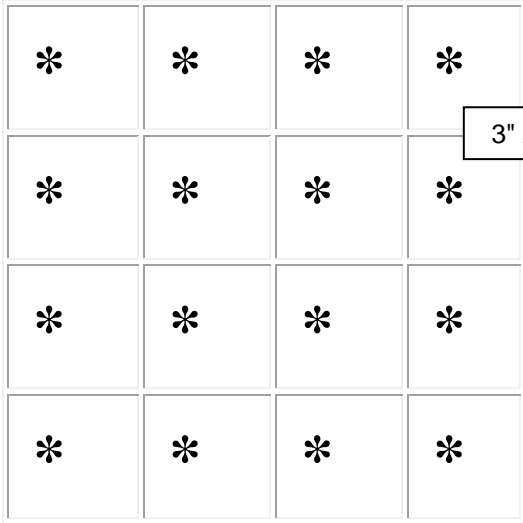
12" X 12" - 1 per square foot



6" x 6" - 4 per square foot



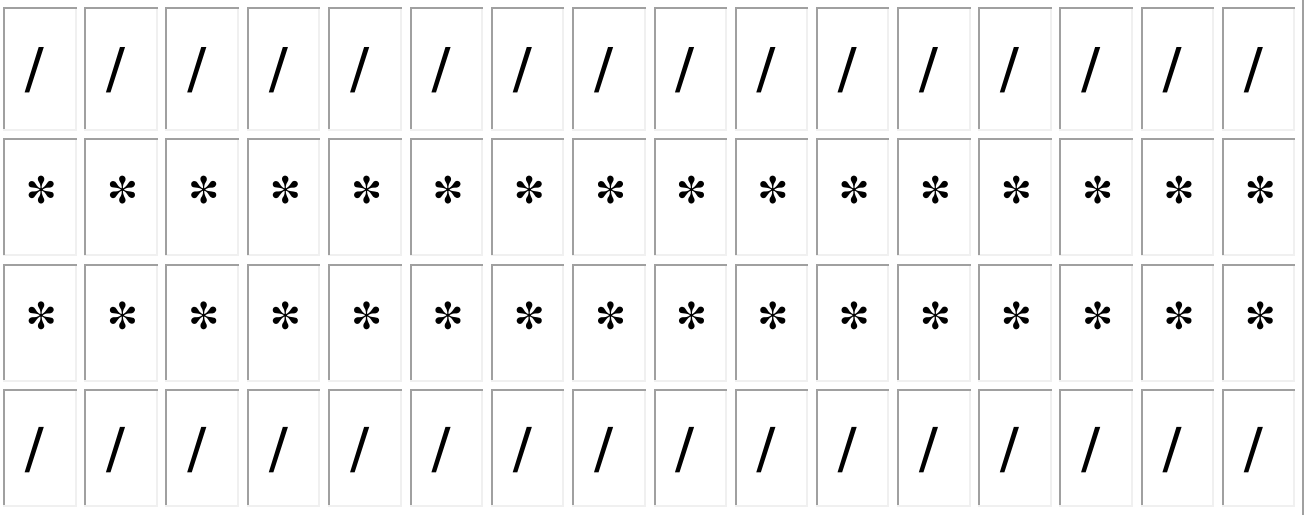
4" x 4" - 9 per square foot



3" x 3" - 16 per square foot

Below depicts a 1 foot X 4 foot area.

Peas or beans - the \* are the plants, the / are planted with radishes, onions, lettuce, parsnip, daikon radishes...

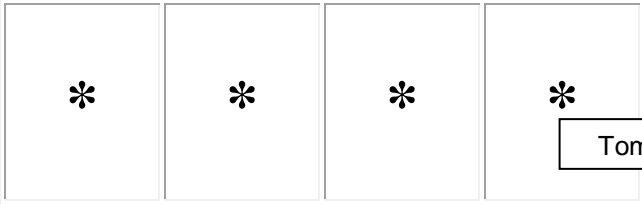


By the time the peas/beans are grown, you've harvested the early radishes, onions, lettuce...

Then turn around and plant other vegetables where the peas/beans were after you pull them out, etc. Fall crops???



Summer Squash - vine-type: 1 ft.' x 4 ft.' space (note each block below is 12" high by 16" wide)



Tomatoes - vine-type: 1'x4' space
